**EASTERN RUMELIA**

'ē-stārn rū-'mēl-yə

(South Bulgaria)

LOCATION — In southern Bulgaria  
GOVT. — An autonomous unit of the Turkish Empire.

CAPITAL — Philippopolis (Plovdiv)

In 1885 the province of Eastern Rumelia revolted against Turkish rule and united with Bulgaria, adopting the new name of South Bulgaria. This union was assured by the Treaty of Bucharest in 1886, following the war between Serbia and Bulgaria.

LOCATION — Northwest coast of South America, bordering on the Pacific Ocean

GOVT. — Republic

AREA — 116,270 (?) sq. mi.

POP. — 12,562,496 (1999 est.)

CAPITAL — Quito

The Republic of Ecuador was so constituted on May 11, 1830, after the Civil War which separated the original members of the Republic of Colombia, founded by Simon Bolivar by uniting the Presidency of Quito with the Viceroyalty of New Grenada and the Captaincy of

Venezuela. The Presidency of Quito became the Republic of Ecuador.

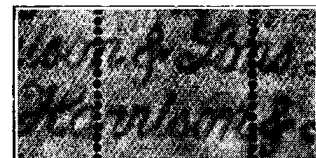

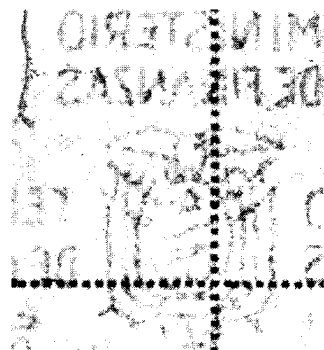
